

# "THE LORD NEEDS THEM"

Now when they drew near to drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to

"Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me.

"If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once."

Matthew 21:1-3, ESV

Kicking off the week that was to be Jesus' last before the crucifixion, was his choice to enter Jerusalem on beast of burden.

As Jesus rode into town, crowds of people formed, recognized something special about the moment, and started shouting good things about Jesus. They proclaimed "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

It was an exciting moment. And there was more to come.

As Jesus reached Jerusalem, he 'cleansed' the temple, healed the blind and lame, and recognized that the praises children were shouting about him were right and proper.

It was a spectacular end to a great day.

But, think about how the day started: Matthew tells us that Jesus sent two disciples to gather the donkey and colt needed for this triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

He sent with them a message for those who cared for the animals: "The Lord Needs Them."

The animals were sent.

On that day, two disciples obeyed, the steward of the animals responded faithfully to Jesus' claim of ownership, and Christ was exalted.

How will you respond when God says to you, "The Lord Needs Them"? Will you respond to bring Glory to God (or to you)?

# FROM: OBJECT LESSONS FROM AFRICAN LIFE BY BETTIE B. PEARSON

# 3 ~ Giving Your Best

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 116:12—How can I repay the Lord for all his goodness to me?

Lesson: We should give our best to Jesus because He gave His life for us.

Objects: A small plate or flat bowl with three to five eggs. A paper towel or napkin crumpled on the bottom can prevent the eggs from rolling.

If you expect a visitor to your home, what do you do to get ready?

Perhaps your mother will ask you to help her clean. You may help her in the kitchen. If your grandparents are coming, perhaps you have made something to give them.

In an African village, when a special visitor is coming, the family prepares their best food. If the visitors are really important, the family will prepare some gift for them. Most families have chickens. A child may be sent to find eggs to give a visitor. (*Show plate of eggs.*) They may only have a few eggs, but they want to give their best to the important friend who is coming, perhaps a church leader or other special person. They want to show love and respect, so they give the visitor all the eggs they can find.

Why not give only one egg to a visitor instead of all they can find? (Pause for answers.)

Jesus is our very special friend. Jesus is God, Who made us! He makes our food; He protects us from harm. Jesus loves us so much He died for us. He is willing to forgive us when we do wrong. Jesus is so wonderful, we should give Him our very best.

How can we give Jesus our best? First of all, He wants our hearts. Have you given your heart to Jesus by asking Him to forgive you and be your friend?

Next, we want to make Him important in our lives by thinking of pleasing Him in all we do. We know God wants us to be kind and loving. He wants us to be obedient and careful in what we say. These are ways to please Jesus and show He is important to us.

Another way to show love to Jesus is to tell our friends how much we love Him. What friends have you told about Him? We also bring offerings to church for God's work.

(*Hold plate of eggs.*) Remember the families who give all their eggs to a visitor? Jesus is a very important Friend, who gave His life for you. Be sure to give Him your best all of your life.



### **Christian Education Skit / Stewardship**

Title Giving Everything

Point Christians give everything to Christ. Stewardship for Christians is not managing

to give a little of our stuff to God, it is yielding everything to Christ.

Actors Needed 4 listeners and 1 preacher

Props Needed a HUGE dollar bill, a HUGE paper clock (that says "My Time" on its face), a

HUGE paper heart, a big trash bag (as an offering bag), a day-timer like planner,

a marker, a pair of scissors

Setting A worship service where the preacher gives a brief message about stewardship

and giving. The listeners then participate in an offering.

Scene Opens As the skit starts, the preacher and listeners walk in and take their places. The

preacher reads a scripture passage about giving (such as Mark 12:38-44). The listeners make a great show of trying to listen – one pays absolute attention, one

fakes nodding off, another elbows the one nodding off.

Dialogue (After the scripture reading, there is no dialogue needed.)

When the Scripture reading is finished, the following happens in sequence:

- 1. One listener gets up to up the offering, and stands holding the bag while the other listeners act.
- 2. One listener pulls out the HUGE dollar, measures 1/10 of the bill, marks it, cuts it out, and makes a big show of placing it in the offering bag.
- 3. One listener pulls out the HUGE clock and the day-timer, studies the day-timer, marks a part of the clock, cuts it out, and makes a big show of placing it in the bag.
- 4. The last listener makes a show of thinking about what to give, and finally pulls out the HUGE heart. As this is done, the other listeners watch carefully. One of them hands the scissors to the listener with the heart.

Now, the last listener makes a show of choosing where to cut the heart. After a little while, the listener prays, folds up the scissors, puts them down, and then places the whole heart in the bag.

- 5. Simultaneously, the listener with the HUGE bill and the one with the HUGE clock look shocked. They show they can't believe what the last listener did. They make it clear that they a reconsidering how much they gave. Finally, they place all of the remaining clock and bill in the bag.
- 6. All four listeners and the preacher gather, point to heaven, kneel, pray, and then leave the room.



Since you'll have several "free days" each month, you could set aside Sundays either to not read at all or to catch up on any readings you may have missed in the past week.

If you finish the month's readings by the twenty-fifth, you could use the final days of the month to study the passages that challenged or intrigued you. \* If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the gospels and the wisdom books this year, and the other two categories next In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.
